This project will have 1 or 2 sketchbook assignments, and a painting component.

JP Sketchbook Assignment

I would like you to do a visual interpretation of a story or fable, in the style of [Jean Paul \(JP\) Langlois](#). I encourage you to base your painting on a story that one of your elders (grandparents, great aunts and uncles ,etc.) has passed down to you and that has meaning to you. Alternately, you may research and do a visual interpretation of an [Aesop's fable](#) that appeals to you.

Study JP's paintings and answer the following in your sketchbook:

1. What are the biggest influences in JP's work?
2. After researching his paintings, which particular series, and individual work, most appealed to you, and why?

After answering these questions, please show your ideation and sketches for the painting you will be completing. You must show 3 sketches of what your painting may look like, and give a written description of what your work is based on.

So in your sketchbook clearly label this assignment “JP Sketchbook Assignment” and be sure to include the following:

- Complete answers to the 2 questions posed above
- 2-3 sketches for your painting
- A written description of what influenced your work, and choice of colours
