## Collage project

## Part 1

The first part of this project will be assembling the materials for your collage.

Remember; this is a collage about YOU. It is essentially a self portrait composed of scavenged materials.

Please answer the following questions in your sketchbook to help you narrow down what materials, artifacts, and images to source.

- 1. What am I passionate about?
- 2. What message do I want to share with the world?
- 3. What are my hobbies?
- 4. What cause am I passionate about?

Once you have answered these questions, it is time to assemble images and artifacts for your collage. Please consider the following materials:

- 1. Fabric
- 2. Magazine cutouts
- 3. Stickers
- 4. Tape
- 5. Labels
- 6. Product packaging
- 7. ?

Place the above materials and cut outs in an envelope that is pasted into your sketchbook.

Your instructor may ask you to submit this as a sketchbook assignment.


## Part 2

Before you paste down your artifacts, assemble them on an 8"x10" piece of paper and photograph the collage. Move the pieces around and take a second photograph. Rearrange the pieces until you have 5 photographs on your phone.

Show these to your friends and instructor

After consultation with your instructor, paste the artifacts and images down in the order you choose.

Next, take a sheet of clear acrylic sheet, and create a 1" grid on it with a fine line marker (see below.)




Tape this sheet of acrylic over the collage.

Take a sheet of letter sized paper, and fold in 4.

Create a 1 ½" square in the center, and cut it out.

Unfold to reveal your 3"x3" viewer.

Do the same, but this time cut a 2" square out of a sheet of paper to create a 4"x4" viewer.



Isolate however many 3"x3" or 4"X4" grid sections you are instructed to. You may use also an alternate coloured pen to differentiate these 4" X 4" sections (see below.)



Your instructor will tell you how many compositions you will copy. Submit the grid in your sketchbook or the assigned location for marking.
