

INTRODUCTION TO AUDIO AND SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

The main learning outcome of this project is to understand how critical audio is to a successful film. Further details of this project may be written in your Film and TV user guide.

Upon completion of this project, you will understand/be able to do the following:

- Locate and download audio files (soundbible.com, freesound.org)
- Understanding of audio formats (.mp3 or .wav)
- Basic understanding of Adobe PP interface
- Ability to save and export an Adobe PP project
- Change the volume of an audio clip using **keyframes** (fade)

Procedure

1. Download your own video file you have shot on your phone or camera. I suggest using **Google Drive**. Students may download a **Creative Commons** or similar video file. This [site](#) is a good start.
2. Import this file into **Premiere Pro** as instructed, save your file now, and save often!
3. Import your audio files into Premiere Pro as instructed
4. You must layer at least 3 different audio clips into your file (Avoid dialogue)
5. Change the audio levels of at least 1 clip
6. Save and export the correct file type for submission to the correct location.
