
Shutter Speeds explained

Shutter speed is controlled by the photographer to stop motion, or to create special artistic effects. On a manual camera it is controlled on the shutter speed selector knob. This is a shutter speed selector knob set to $\frac{1}{4}$ of a second.(In photographic terms this is a rather long exposure.)
