WORKSAFE REVIEW MATERIAL FOR THE TEST:

Read the following questions and then go to the link for the answer. You can make notes for yourself. Do **not** hand in the answers.

- 1. What are the <u>top three injuries</u> that happen to young workers? Do you think lifting objects is #1 because young workers think they are strong and not vulnerable?
- 2. Does it appear that <u>young workers are more likely to be injured in the first six months on</u> <u>the job?</u>
- 3. If you are not working due to an unsafe condition or tool, does it appear that you should both <u>refuse to work and talk to your supervisor?</u>

- 4. Does it appear that <u>your right to refuse unsafe work is guaranteed by occupational</u> <u>health and safety regulations?</u>
- 5. Does it appear that it is your responsibility to train other workers?
- 6. As you <u>read regulation excerpt 3.23</u>, does it seem that employers are required to train each worker, or do they need to have a number of people before they have to train anybody?
- 7. Does it seem that an employer needs to train all of the workers to perform <u>first aid?</u> Look at page 2 of this document.
- 8. In the document about rights and responsibilities, do you see any reference to the employer being able to take <u>money from you for training?</u>
- 9. From the interactive guide, near slide # 8, do you see any reference to supervisors having <u>safety rights</u>, which regular workers do not?
- 10. Is investigating unsafe conditions a responsibility of the supervisor? Look at page 3 of this document.
- 11. Read this decision and decide if work rules apply to apprentices.
- 12. <u>Employers must keep work vehicles safe</u>. When they are doing this, do they have to ensure that a qualified person inspects the vehicle prior to the first shift?
- 13. Can a person work above <u>3 metres</u> without fall protection?
- 14. Is it ok for a <u>first aid</u> attendant to be under 16 years of age?
- 15. It is your responsibility to provide your own PPE. What is PPE?

- 16. Do you think Worksafe BC sees <u>bullying</u> as a workplace matter? Do they have regulations about it?
- 17. When someone is <u>working alone</u>, there are certain things employers need to do. Do you see all of the following employer requirements within regulation 4.22.1 (2)?
 - having the worker 19 years of age or older
 - premises monitored by video surveillance
 - good visibility in and out of the premises
 - a time lock safe
- What does <u>MSI</u> stand for? Do all of these injuries seem to qualify as MSI? Back Strain Sprained Wrist or ankle Tendinitis Carpal tunnel Syndrome
- 19. There are a <u>number of things</u> you can do to ensure that your work area is safer as you work.Do you see anything mentioned about reporting to Worksafe BC as a general strategy?
