

Genre Presentation

For this presentation, you will be giving a presentation to the class about what one of your favourite film genres, or sub-genres is.

You may not be familiar with all the different film sub-genres, so make sure you take a look [here](#) for many examples.

Your presentation does not need to be you in front of the class, in fact, you are encouraged to narrate your presentation and have it presented as a video file if you wish.

You should include clips from different movies in the genre that you have selected. I suggest downloading clips from YouTube (I'll show you how to do this.)

I would like you to cover some of the following points:

- What are some of the classic examples of this genre or subgenre?
- Why do YOU like this sub genre? This is important. I'm more interested in why you associate with this (sub) genre as opposed to knowing all the facts about it
- Who are some directors who are famous for this (sub) genre?

Technically, your film should include the following:

An introduction

Proper narration (slow, thought out, proper annunciation)

Good use of transitions

A proper summation

Proper a/v set up (if you are presenting in person) **OR** submission of the proper file type (digital submission)
